## A Word from Brother Emanuel:

#### SAVED BY GRACE THROUGH FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST

Some people are convinced that they must do good works to obtain salvation. Should we do good works to be saved or for salvation? No. The good news is, that salvation is not a goal to be achieved, but a gift to be received. It is a gift, and not a reward. It is all of God. What amazing grace! "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." Eph. 2:8-10 NKJ.

Salvation cannot be of works because our Lord Jesus Christ in love for us, died on the cross, shed His precious blood for the forgiveness of our sins, and has completed the work of salvation at the cross. The work at the cross is finished (Jn. 17:4; 19:30). The Apostle Paul reminds the believers at Corinth, and us, "...that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the scriptures" 1 Cor. 15:3,4. We are not saved by good works plus faith, but by a faith that works.

Having been saved by God's grace through faith, should we do good works? Yes. As Christians, we do good works in contrast to works of darkness and wicked works. We should "abound to every good work" (2 Cor.9:8) and be "zealous of good works" (Titus 2:14). "It is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure" (Phil. 2:13). Our good works are evidences that we have been born again.

Would you by faith receive Jesus as your Lord and Savior today? (Jn. 1:12). Jesus has done the great work at the cross and He is willing to do a great work in your life. Jesus is still the way, the truth and the life (Jn. 14:6). # Reflections from Scripture by M.S.

#### THE CROSS OF CHRIST

The Cross has been a symbol of Christianity since the 2<sup>nd</sup> Century, but to the child of God it is not just a symbol, but a reality. It was on the Cross our Lord Jesus Christ suffered and paid the penalty for our sins. He was scourged (beaten with an instrument intended to inflict serious bodily harm, suffering or vengeance), wounded by a crown of thorns placed on His head, crucified on the Cross at Calvary – the

method used by the Romans to provide a slow, painful, humiliating and public death – nailed to the Cross by his hands and feet, spat upon, mocked and pierced through his side with a spear. Our sins were paid for with His blood shed on the Cross (Eph. 1:7). Sadly today the Cross has no meaning to many, and is an offence greater than it was in the early church (Gal. 5:11, 6:12). The Apostle Paul declared "....God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ..." (Gal. 6:14).

What does the Cross mean to you and me? It tells of God's love "God so loved the world..." John 3:16; "...God loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins." 1 John 4:10; our salvation is secure, peace was obtained through His blood shed on the Cross (Col. 1:20) and all who believe on Him have everlasting life. His grace and mercy are extended to all because of His love for us. It is no wonder that many hymn writers have been inspired to write hymns about the Cross that have touched many hearts, - such hymns as "When I survey the wondrous Cross" (\*S.S. 283), "We sing the praise of Him who died...upon the Cross" (S.S.175). Let us consider the words of Jesus in Matthew 16:24 when He said to His disciples, "if any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." The words of the hymn "Lift high the Cross, the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore His sacred Name" (George Hitchin) is so applicable today.

"Thy cross, Thy cross! 'tis there we see What Thou, our blessed Savior art; There all the love that dwells in Thee Was laboring in Thy breaking heart." S.S. 32
